

I truly love this time of year! May the Holy Spirit refresh our souls, wash away worry and fill us with rejuvenated hope as we go about offering kindness, compassion, and encouragement like a satisfying drink to a thirsty soul. I pray that we all may have a season of regeneration in the peace that drips from Christ Jesus through His Spirit!


