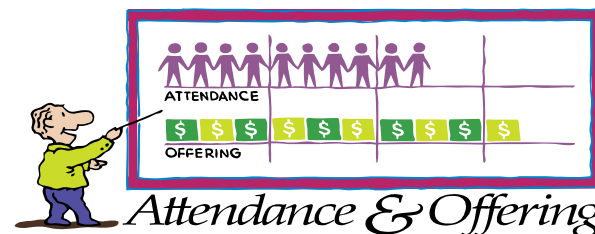

THE ASKABLE GOD

I have noticed that throughout the pages of the Bible, God is never portrayed as being threatened by honest questions. From Job's anguished cries (Job 3; 13:3) to the Psalms' bold "How long, O Lord?" (Psalm 13:1), Scripture shows that questioning can be an expression of faith rather than rebellion. When God finally answers Job, He does not crush him for asking but responds mercifully out of the whirlwind (Job 38-41), revealing His wisdom and sovereignty. These passages demonstrate that God meets seekers in the midst of their uncertainty and invites them into deeper trust rather than silencing their inquiry.

In the Gospels, Jesus consistently welcomes sincere questions. He speaks patiently with Nicodemus, who comes with searching questions about being "born again" (John 3:1-21). After the resurrection, Jesus responds to Thomas's doubt not with rejection but with tangible reassurance, saying, "Do not disbelieve, but believe" (John 20:24-29). Even when the questions are imperfectly formed, Christ engages them with truth and grace, aiming not merely to inform the mind but to transform the heart (John 8:31-32). His example teaches believers that questions are opportunities for discipleship, not threats to faith.

Because God handles questions relationally, His people are called to do the same. Scripture urges believers to be prepared to give an answer "with gentleness and respect" (1 Peter 3:15), reflecting the character of Christ in both content and tone. James reminds the community of faith to ask God for wisdom (James 1:5), while Paul instructs mature believers to restore and guide others patiently (Galatians 6:1). In this way, Christians become instruments through whom God often provides clarity—walking alongside doubters, listening carefully, pointing them back to Scripture, and trusting the Holy Spirit to bring understanding over time. - t.n.


