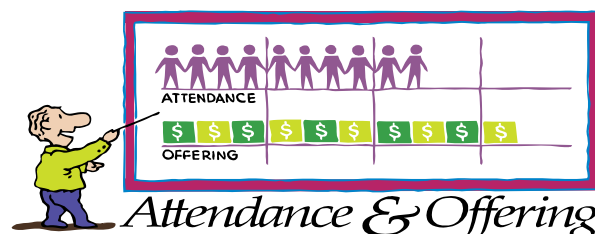

As we celebrate Independence Day and continue commemorating our nation's 250th anniversary, I am reminded of how much we have to be thankful for. The Founding Fathers understood a profound truth—that our rights come not from kings, presidents, or a congress, but from our Creator. The Declaration of Independence affirms that we are "endowed by our Creator with certain unalienable Rights." That simple statement changed the course of history because it recognized that our form of government is underneath the authority of God—not the other way around. For us as Christians, a sense of patriotism can always be enhanced by Biblical truth because the heart of Scripture's guidance is imbedded in our nation's founding documents. We celebrate because we are grateful to be part of a country which values life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness – and while we are thankful to be blessed as citizens of the United States, ultimately our highest allegiance belongs to Jesus Christ, the King of kings. True hope for America will not be found in Washington, but in hearts transformed by the Gospel of Jesus Christ. As we celebrate this Independence Day weekend, let us thank God for the freedoms we enjoy; let us pray for our leaders as Scripture commands (1 Timothy 2:1–2), and let us support those who serve our nation in the military, law enforcement, and public service. Most importantly, let us faithfully proclaim the saving message of Jesus Christ, knowing that lasting peace, true freedom and ETERNAL LIFE are found only in Him.

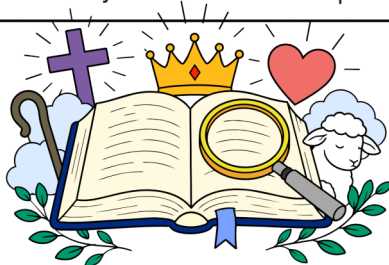

Still Worth More Than You Know

A speaker opened his seminar by holding up a \$20 bill and asking a crowd of 200 people, "Who would like this?"

Nearly every hand went up.

"I'll give it to one of you," he said. "But first..." He crumpled the bill tightly in his fist. "Who still wants it?"

Hands remained in the air.

He dropped it to the floor and ground it under his shoe. Then he picked up the wrinkled, dirty bill. "How about now?"
