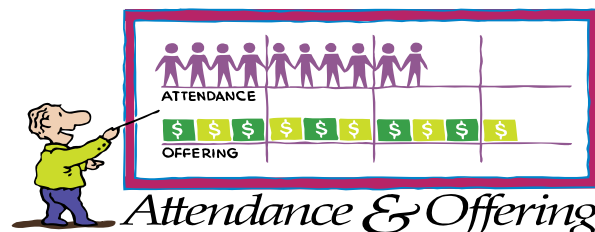

This is the day that the Lord has made, and we are thankful to be able to gather in His name to sing about His goodness, to connect again with the truth of His Word, to encourage one another in our individual walks of faith, and to gear up for each of our personalized missions in the week ahead! The New Testament teaches about the Mission of God and how the followers of Jesus are motivated to pursue its extant success and even its eventual completion. It is an exciting prospect and also a humbling experience; He teaches us to look at life and people and politics with spiritual eyes rather than earthly eyes.

For example, in the picture above, what do you see? In an earthly way, probably not much, maybe just an empty spot with overgrown weeds, or a purposeless wall with some unkept dirt? Thankfully, God sees differently than people see – 1 Samuel 16:7 says He does not look at things the way people look at them. People look at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart. The apostle Paul reminds the church to fix our eyes on what is unseen and eternal, not on what is seeable and temporary (2 Cor. 4:18). By the end of today, I hope you can see the heart of the picture above. The Southside church of Christ has been extremely effective in spreading the gospel of God, and it brings great joy to my life to be apart of it. Thanks be to God, and to all of you for supporting these efforts! Just stop and think about the wealth of wisdom we have in Christ, and realize that it is a blessing beyond measure to be actively involved in the ongoing mission of His church!!! May He bless each of us today with a renewed sense of appreciation and participation in His mission, and may our eyes be enlightened by His eternal vision.

Studies show many Americans don't get enough sleep, and the effects can take a toll on both body and mind. Our spiritual lives follow a similar rhythm. When we rush from one task to the next without pausing to spend time with God, we can feel just as drained. We need consistent, quiet moments with Him to stay grounded, encouraged and strong in our faith.

Even Jesus made space for this kind of rest. Luke 5:16 tells us that He often withdrew to quiet places to pray. If He needed that time with the Father, how much more do we? When we step away from the noise and listen for God's voice, we find the renewal our souls have been longing for.

UPDATE

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, greetings. Brothers and sisters, I am practically living with our Kuna brothers and sisters. Living with them is not easy. Due to the plagues of malaria, tuberculosis, and leishmaniasis, I had to leave the area. There have already been deaths from these causes. The congregations are fighting against all these diseases. All the brothers and sisters remain steadfast in their faith in Christ. Due to our limited knowledge of Spanish, we have resorted to purchasing hymnals and Bibles in their own language. The congregation in the village of Wala currently has 80 members and over one hundred children. We are meeting two or three times a day, making the most of our time. We must respect traditional celebrations. Brothers and sisters, due to the inclement weather, we have not been able to visit our brothers and sisters in Puerto Limón. We maintain contact with them through WhatsApp. In the Darién jungle, it rains almost every day. The rivers become swollen and dangerous, rising from two feet of water to 20 feet or more in an hour. With the rain comes all kinds of insects: millions of mosquitoes, rats, cockroaches, snakes—they all want to live inside the Kuna people's thatched houses. The new building has become too small. I will be building a room for the Kuna preacher brother. Brothers and sisters, we need your prayers as well as your financial support. Without it, it would be very difficult for us to preach the gospel to all these people. Thank you, thank you so much, for everything you do so that the gospel of Christ may be preached to everyone.
